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

Mr Smith's Sponsored Walk

In this year's Easter holidays our caretaker, Mr Smith, will be walking the West Highland Way in Scotland and has offered to use his walk as a fundraiser for the school.



The West Highland Way is a long-distance walk from Milngavie, just north of Glasgow, to Fort William, some 96 miles further north. The route passes alongside Loch Lomond and The Trossachs before skirting along the edge of Ben Nevis and Glen Coe, site of the famous Jacobean revolt in 1692. Each year an estimated 40,000 hikers walk the WHW to admire its dramatic and beautiful scenery and soon realise why The National Geographic lists it as one of the world's Top 10 trail walks.

We are delighted that Mr Smith is taking part in this walk and that he would like any sponsorship to go towards school. We are asking you to sponsor his walk in the hopes that we can raise £1000 towards playtime enhancements.

During the walk, Mr Smith plans to send back a write-up or two of his exploits, together with an occasional photo: any reports or photos will be emailed out by the school, so that everyone can track his progress.
